

Teaching Points – The Cello Sherpa Episode 1

- 4. What can you improve when relating to your peers? Your teachers and professors? Your section and section leaders? Other musicians and artists? Support staff such as librarians, personnel, stage crew, sound engineers, etc.?
- 5. Steven Isserlis described "Concertos as large-scale chamber music" and "conversations between different voices;" how does this compare to how you view concertos? Do you agree or disagree with this position and why?
